




Population by age - eThekwini






Population by age - iLembe






Population by age - Umgungundlovu












KZN Highest level of Education (CS 2016)






Highest level of education (iLembe Municipalities)










Highest level of education (Umgungundlovu Municipalities)





Challenges encountered in the development of people – Walking to education institution vs distance










eThekwini Poverty headcount and Intensity by, 2011-2016






iLembe Poverty headcount and Intensity by, 2011-2016







Poverty indicators by municipality (iLembe)






Umgungundlovu Poverty headcount and Intensity by, 2011-2016




The challenges of unemployment, especially amongst the youth continue









70,5% of KZN's approximately 810 000 unemployed were made up of Youth in Q2 2017




24 out of a 100 individuals in the labour force (unemployed + employed) of KZN were unemployed during the 2nd Quarter of 2017

Conclusion

- Demographic characteristics indicate that both eThekwini and Umgungundlovu have a high share of <u>youth</u> that are of working age (e.g. 24 – 34), while iLembe has a higher share of youth 15 – 19.
- All average household sizes for the three districts were below 4 thus indicating more <u>nuclear households</u>.
- Over 70% of households are <u>formal</u> although in iLembe Maphumulo indicated higher <u>traditional dwellings</u> than formal ones. The highest share of informal dwellings in iLembe were in Kwadukuza and in Umgungundlovu, Richmond had the highest share of informal dwellings.
- Only 29% of the Ethekwini population had a highest level of education as <u>Matric</u>. 17% of population in iLembe had <u>no</u> <u>schooling</u> while 7% of population in Umgunundlovu has a <u>tertiary education</u>.



Conclusion

- In <u>iLembe</u> grant recipients are the highest in Ndwedwe while the poverty headcount in 2016 were the highest in Maphumulo. The intensity of poverty in Maphumulo also increased from 2011 to 2016.
- In <u>Umgungundlovu</u> grant recipients were the highest in Impendle as well as the poverty headcount in 2016. The intensity of poverty was the highest in Mpofana in 2016.
- The unemployed in <u>KZN</u> are made up mainly of <u>youth</u> (approximately 70%).
- The <u>unemployment rate in KZN</u> was approximately 24% during Quarter 2 of 2017.
