KwaZulu-Natal (KZN) Provincial Government honoured the public servants, who despite all odds, delivered service to KZN people. Premier Sihle Zikalala handed over Premier's Service Excellence Awards to appreciate the public servants, who went all out to deliver service despite the Covid-19 pandemic. The awards ceremony took place at Inkosi Albert Luthuli International Convention Centre (ICC) in Durban.

The awards categories included Best Covid-19 Team during the National Lockdown, Best Public Health Facility during the Covid-19 pandemic, Best Frontline Service Delivery Employee of the Year and Best Public Service Innovator during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Zikalala said: "once again, allow me to pay tribute to all the shortlisted nominees for your dedication to your work and for going the extra mile to put a smile on the faces of our clients and stakeholders.


We celebrate you for treating our people, especially the vulnerable poor, with utmost respect and dignity. In you, we have a cadre of public service officials who respect themselves, value their work, and never treat clients with contempt and disdain as if they were doing them a favour. "

Zikalala described the awardees as officials that made the public service experience live up to the true meaning of Ubuntu.

These awards were initiated in KZN for the first time in 1999 to recognise and reward service excellence from the public officials. KZN recognised those public servants who were successfully implementing the Batho-Pele principles and enhancing Operation Sukuma Sakhe in the war rooms in all the districts.

This KZN initiative was later adopted by the national government in 2013 in the form of the National Batho Pele Excellence Awards led by the Department of Public Service and Administration. Winners in the provincial awards were entered to represent KZN in the national awards.

Zikalala said: "We take pride that the KwaZulu-Natal's Excellence Service Awards recognise employees in all categories — from general workers in a ward to senior government officials in all three spheres of government. All the men and women that we are honouring this evening are passionate about people's development and the progress of KwaZulu-Natal".







KZN Provincial Public Service Training Academy launches Championing Anti-Discrimination Training Programme in the public service



The Provincial Public Service Training Academy in partnership with the National School of Government officially launched the Championing Anti-Discrimination Training Programme in the public service.

The Anti-Discrimination Training Programme in the public service is in line with Department of Public Service and Administration (DPSA) Circular 11 of 2021 issued by the Minister of DPSA in December 2021. Senior Managers were targeted as the first cohort to attend the one-month online training programme.

KZN is the first province to officially launch this programme. About 34 senior managers from all Provincial Departments in KZN attended the launch whereby they gained further insight from the Principal of the National School of Government into the importance of attending this compulsory programme which is being offered by the National School of Government

Anti-Discrimination emerged as a major theme for the transformation of the public service. This online programme has been developed explicitly for public servants to intervene in and ultimately end discrimination in the public service, among public servants and by public servants against the public.

The purpose of this programme is to examine belief, attitudes, thinking and behaviour to strengthen public sector officials to be capable of combating discrimination wherever they may find it.

The Anti-Discrimination Training Programme forms part of the Medium-Term Strategic Framework target in Priority Six Cluster Plan of action on Social Cohesion.

About 100 senior managers from the provincial administration will be enrolled and attend the programme this year. Thereafter the programme will be extended to all other levels of staff. **Sally Reddy**























KZN aims to participate in the multi-trillion-dollar Halaal economy

KwaZulu-Natal (KZN) Premier Sihle Zikalala spoke at a trade and investment dinner that marked the Trade and Investment Indaba and World Halaal Day at the INkosi Albert Luthuli Convention Centre (Durban ICC) on 22 March 2022.

The Halaal economy is a multi-trillion-dollar opportunity that captured the core of faith-based Muslim spend.

Sectors of the economy included food, pharmaceuticals, cosmetics, modest fashion, Islamic finance among others.

The KZN Halal Initiative was started in 2015 through a feasibility study conducted by Trade and Investment KZN to investigate the scope of the trade and investment within the global Halal sector. KZN's route development strategy aimed at connectivity with lucrative Islamic

markets to establish business and tourism linkages. KZN now has direct flights exist between Turkey, the United Arab Emirates and Qatar.

Singapore was identified as a key medium-term target.

A Halaal-accredited infrastructure project for logistics was investigated in partnership with Dube TradePort. The study would explore the feasibility of the development of a Halaal accredited facility in the current air cargo terminal, that could facilitate the movement of Halaal perishable goods globally.
